Save time and money. Complete the program for less than \$11,000 (2021-2022 tuition/fees for 100% online programs is \$356.06/credit).

FLEXIBLE – 100% ONLINE

Our individualized 30-credit program is designed for the working RN and is offered fully online. You can attend part-time or full-time and are not locked into a cohort format. Take just one course at a time, or up to four courses per semester. The program may be completed in just one year with full-time enrollment! We offer eight and 16-week sections in fall and spring semesters, and 8-week courses during summer term. All courses are offered every term including summer. There are no mandatory login times, no scheduled clinicals or courses. Do your schoolwork around work and family time. We admit students five times per year including fall, mid-fall, spring, mid-spring and summer semesters, so you can start sooner!

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS: MAJOR COMMON CORE-30 CREDITS/7 COURSES

- NURS 320W-Critical Inquiry and Evidence Based Practice for RNs (4cr)
- NURS 362-Family and Societal Nursing for RNs (4cr)
- NURS 382-Holistic Nursing Assessment and Practice (4cr)
- NURS 402-Psychosocial/Inter-Professional Communications for RNs (4cr)
- NURS 420-Quality, Safety, Value and Informatics in Nursing Practice for RNs (4cr)
- NURS 482W-Population Focused Care for RNs (6cr)
- NURS 492-Nursing Capstone and Leadership for Baccalaureate Practice (4cr)

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Apply for admission into Minnesota State University, Mankato
- Apply for admission into the RN-BS Completion Program
- Unrestricted RN License by start of RN-BS Program
- You may apply before you take the RN-NCLEX, and even prior to graduation from your AD Nursing program
- Minimum career grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale (may appeal)
- Minimum grade of C in all previous nursing courses
- A statistics course is no longer required!

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

A total of 120 semester credits are needed for the BS in nursing and include the following:

- 30 required major common core credits in the RN-BS Nursing program (listed above).
- 60 Credits are transferred in from your AD Program.
- 30 RN Option Credits are granted for your RN Licensure. These credits, along with the major common core, will fulfill the 40 upper division credits needed for your BS degree.
- Minnesota State Mankato requires completion of General Education credits (Goal Areas 1-10) for all baccalaureate degree graduates. Only an official evaluation of credit will determine the requirements you have remaining. If you have completed the MN Transfer Curriculum, have an AA Degree or Four-year degree, you have fulfilled the general education requirements at Minnesota State University, Mankato.
