*Must be active on a State Nurse Aide Registry at the time of application. *Must be CPR certified before beginning the program

- **General Education Courses** listed in black font in semesters 1-4 can be taken earlier, but no later than the identified semester.
- **RN program application:** Complete the nursing program application. All prerequisite courses must be completed with a grade of "C," or higher, and have a combined minimum GPA of 2.75 or higher. Complete the HSRT Exam (Health Science Reasoning Test) with a cut score of 75% or above. *HSRT online version is not accepted.* Submit a copy of the HSRT report and proof of being on a State Nurse Aide Registry with application.
- **RN program admission** is based strictly on total points. To calculate, add your HSRT Test Score, divided by 10, to the prerequisite course GPA (GPA must be 2.75 or higher). *Point Sample:* HSRT Test Score of 77% divided by 10 = 7.70 + 3.75 GPA = 11.45 total points earned. **Review prerequisite course GPA via the Academic Records tab in your E-Services account. View the Pre-Nursing/Liberal Arts AS Degree Audit Report.**
- **Admitted students** are required to register for, attend, and pass NURS1200 to begin the nursing program. This 16-hour orientation takes place in August for the Fall semester start and December for the Spring semester start. Admitted students must successfully complete all courses in the indicated semester to progress to the next semester.
- Clinical requirements will require a background check, CPR certification, health insurance, immunizations (includes being current on COVID-19 vaccines and an annual flu shot).
