



## MASTER COURSE OUTLINE

A. HSER 1104 Human Services – Field Experience II

B. COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course provides students a second opportunity to learn about human service work experientially. Students perform 30 hours of field experience and spend an additional 15 hours in the classroom preparing for and processing these experiences. Students will also have the opportunity to learn from guest speakers from the field. Students learn more about human services and focus on intervention approaches. Additional intervention approaches are presented. Prerequisites: Concurrent enrollment in HSER 1103.
