A. COSM 1535 Advanced Exfoliation

B. COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is designed for students enrolled in the Advanced Practice Esthetics program. Students will focus on advanced exfoliation methods including medium and deep chemical peels, microdermabrasion treatment procedures, and dermaplaning procedures.
(3 Cr – 1 lect, 2 lab)
