A. Program Elements

- Review of College expectations and policy at Student-Athletic Orientation
- Review of College expectations and policy at International Student Orientation
- Student Conduct Policy includes an educational sanction for drug and alcohol violations and screenings for frequent offenders.
- Student Handbook includes conduct policies related to drug and alcohol violations and health risks.
- Alcohol and drug misconduct sanctions include an education component.
- Alcohol and drug misconduct sanctions apply to students, student organization members, student-athletes, and the off-campus conduct of students.
- Student Housing has clearly stated conduct policy and includes an educational component in their resident meetings
- A Nursing Department Wellness Fair is conducted annually to for some peerto-peer education
- Counseling services are provided on each campus to provide referral services as needed
- Health course includes drug and alcohol abuse learning outcomes
- The Human Services and Nursing programs include drug and alcohol abuse learning outcomes
- Open Door Clinic is on campus each year to provide information and referral sources

- Educate students on the health risks associated with abuse.
- Educate students on the criminal penalties associated with the violation of alcohol and drug abuse laws.
- Educate students on treatment options in the area.
- Encourage responsible decision making concerning the use of alcohol, tobacco, and drugs.
